



CREW SERVICE: GUIDELINES

Together, we are one Crew. Our commander is Jesus. In 1 Corinthians 4:1, the word used for “minister” means “under-rower.” This refers to servants who sat below the decks of ships to pull the oars and row in time with one another at their captain’s commands. In Ephesians 4:13, the word used to describe the Body of Christ attaining “fullness” is defined “like a ship fully manned with sailors.” Like sailors on a well-run ship, each of us has a unique and important role of service. We rely on one another as we seek to establish a dwelling place for God.

<p>SERVING THE KING</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Do what you do as unto the Lord. ✓ Invite God into your work. Ask Him to help you do your work and finish it on time with excellence. ✓ Remember that your Crew and Leadership are relying on you to fulfill your assigned tasks.
<p>FULFILLING RESPONSIBILITIES TOGETHER</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Learn the job description and responsibilities of your Crew. Understand your own role and responsibilities. ✓ Delegate and/or rotate responsibilities within your Crew so that everyone contributing. ✓ Prioritize and offer yourself fully to seeing your Crew complete its tasks. Many hands make light work. ✓ When you have completed your assigned tasks, offer to help others fulfill theirs. ✓ Don't drift off of your Crew's purpose.
<p>PRIORITIZING COMMUNICATION</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Keep communication within your Crew as clear, open, and as all-inclusive as possible. ✓ Use the Church Center App and other tools to stay in touch with your fellow Crew Members.
<p>LOVING & SUBMITTING TO ONE ANOTHER</p>	<p>We are equals as God's children with different levels of responsibility, and God-given authority.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Love one another. Help one another. ✓ Submit to your leaders as this is pleasing to God and help things run decently and in order.
<p>BEING WISE ABOUT SAFETY</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Use wisdom and take the necessary precautions when attempting difficult tasks. ✓ Ask for help when you need it. Stay alert for hazards and let your leader know of any potential dangers we should be aware of.
